Jeremy Arthur is President and CEO of the Chamber of Commerce Association of Alabama. The Chamber of Commerce Association of Alabama (CCAA) is a 120+ member organization representing chambers of commerce throughout the State of Alabama. Through this office, he serves as the chief administrative executive ultimately responsible for the total operations of the Association. He serves as the primary staff point of contact for the Association Officers, Executive Committee, Board of Directors, and members. In addition, Jeremy is responsible for directing the efforts of a joint agreement known as The Partnership with the Business Council of Alabama. The Business Council of Alabama and the CCAA, through a unique relationship known as The Partnership, together represent the interests of some one million working Alabamians through its member companies and local chambers of commerce.

Jeremy has served as a member of several national organizations including the Board of Directors of the Auburn University Alumni Association, where he chaired the Special Projects & Events Committee. He is also a member of the American Society for Public Administration and the Association of Chamber of Commerce Executives.
