Joseph Henning, IOM, CAE, serves as president and chief executive officer of the Henry County (GA) Chamber of Commerce. Prior to that, he served 14 years as president and CEO of the Aurora Regional (IL) Chamber of Commerce.

Henning is a 2009 graduate of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation's Institute for Organization Management. He holds a bachelor's degree in public relations and a master's degree focusing on organizational development from Northern Illinois University as well as a certificate in not-for-profit management from the University of Illinois at Chicago.

He has served as chair of the Midwest Board of Regents in 2012 and 2013. In 2017, he served as chair of the national Board of Trustees for the program and continues to serve as a faculty member.
